# Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

#### **Opinion**

#### Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements in accordance with the Chartered Accountants Act, 1949 that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs, financial performance and cash flows of the Branch in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the

- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with the management regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide the management with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.
